





MCAA Olympic Spotlight



Gabe Gardner - Gabe represented Team USA in Men's Volleyball twice, having played at the 2004 Athens Olympics and the 2008 Beijing Olympics. He won a gold medal during the 2008 summer games. Gabe is a Stanford University alum and is currently enrolled in the MCAA program.

Chris Segesman - Chris represented Team USA in Men's Water Polo during the 2004 Athens Olympics. He was a three time All-American at Cal State Long Beach. He currently is the Head Water Polo Coach and Director of Aquatics at Mater Dei High School in Southern California. Chris graduated from the MCAA program in 2013.





Misty May-Treanor - Misty represented Team USA in Women's Beach Volleyball three times, having played at the 2004 Athens Olympics, 2008 Beijing Olympics, and 2012 London Olympics. She won a gold medal at each Olympic Games. Misty also was awarded numerous accolades while attending Cal State Long Beach. She graduated from the MCAA program in 2013.

Michelle Venturella- Michelle represented Team USA in Women's Softball during the 2000 Sydney Olympics. She won a gold medal during the Sydney Games. She earned two All-American honors during her time at Indiana University and was elected into the Indiana Hall of Fame in 2012. Michelle currently is the Head Coach at Washington University in St. Louis, and is currently enrolled in the MCAA program.





Staciana Winfield- Staciana represented Team USA in Swimming during the 2000 Sydney Olympics. She won a gold medal during the Sydney Games. Staciana and her teammate set a world record in the 4x50-meter relay as well. During her time at the University of California, Berkeley, she was named team captain twice. Staciana now coaches for Concordia University Irvine and graduated from the MCAA program in 2012.
