Reviewing With Note Cards

Step #1: Read a question aloud from the note card.

<u>Step #2</u>: Without looking, recite the answer aloud. (If the note card is a problem/solution card, use scrap paper to write out the solution from memory).

Step #3: Turn the note card over & check to make sure you got the answer correct.

Step #4: If you got the answer right, place the card in the "I know this " pile and move on to the next note card.

Step #5: If you got the answer wrong, read the answer aloud and place the card in the "I don't know this, yet" pile.

Step #6: Review the "I don't know this pile" once every 2-3 days. Review the "I know this" pile 1 or 2 times a week.

The Rules of the "Game"

- 1) Purchase note cards recording main ideas, details, problems, and solutions.
- **2) Turn main points from lectures and textbooks into questions -** Place a question on one side of a note card and its answer on the other.
- **3) Recite questions and answers -** This will reveal what has and has not been learned before an exam is taken when something can still be done about it.
- ➤ The more often note cards are recited and reviewed, the more likely information is to move from short-term memory toward long-term memory.
- Unless recitation of material is done repeatedly and regularly, it is normal to forget material on exams.
