

MCAA Alum and Olympic Gold Medalist has been named the Director of Volleyball at Long Beach City College.





DEAN'S DEVOTION A Servant in God's Hall of Fame

In Mark 10:42-45, Jesus pointed to a group of Romans nearby and said, "You know that the rulers in this world lord it over their people, and officials flaunt their authority over those under them. ⁴³ But among you it will be different. Whoever wants to be a leader among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴ and whoever wants to be first among you must be the slave of everyone else. ⁴⁵ For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve others and to give his life as a ransom for many."

These verses bring to mind our friend Dave Cowen who took these words of Jesus very seriously. Dave was our colleague in the MCAA Office for 9 years and each day he modelled Jesus words. In early summer of 2016 the doctors discovered a cancerous tumor in Dave's brain. Despite a valiant fight and after numerous surgeries, Dave went to see his Lord on December 28, 2016. He would be the first to say that he was not perfect, but if you were asked to name someone who lived the words of Jesus it would be Dave. He understood that joyful living is sacrificial giving. Dave knew that we do not give up anything. Instead we are returning what God has loaned to us. He understood Jesus words in Matthew 6:21, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." You see, we can give without loving, but we cannot love without giving. Dave gave joyfully and his positive attitude was contagious!

When you asked Dave why he was so positive his smiling response was either, "I woke up this morning and I wasn't looking at sod!" or he would recite the words of Psalm 118:24, "This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it."

Dave was on a mission to find someone to encourage. Time and again you could hear him on the phone saying," You can do this and I will help you." When faculty or staff would pass by his office with a concerned look on their face, he would call out from his office, "I love you!"

Dave's talents and gifts were many and he was a servant leader in every role he held before joining the MCAA team at Concordia. As a teacher in special education and history; or as an Athletic Director, Asst. Principal, Principal or Asst. Superintendent of the Anaheim Union School District, Dave was a selfless individual who understood Jesus words, "It is more blessed to give than to receive." Each time we hosted dinners for MCAA students in our home, Dave arrived early to set up tables, hang signs and butter bread. At commencement ceremonies Dave was serving water, setting up tables and handing out cookies in the welcome tent, rather than dressing in academic garb and processing with the faculty.

As God's servant Dave never failed to keep Him in the conversation. His prayers – especially at our MCAA meetings – were clearly from the heart. He invited God into the equation and when that happens all bets are off!

When death is staring you in the face it is difficult to have a sense of humor, but I recall Dave's response to one of the emails I sent with words of encouragement. He told me that he had had his first infusion treatment; the same one that had been given to President Jimmy Carter. He said, "I think it went pretty good, but one thing I hope it doesn't do is turn me into a dang democrat!"

Dave loved his family. He was thankful when Linda said "Yes" and became his wife. More than once he said, "Linda is my lover and my best friend. But most of all, she helped me find Jesus as my Lord and Savior." For that reason alone, as he faced his future, Dave would say with all confidence, "I'm in a win-win situation. I win if I stay and I win if I go." Dave has won a place in God's Hall of Fame.

God's Hall of Fame

To have your name inscribed up there is greater yet by far,

than all the halls of fame down here and every man-made star.

This crowd on earth, they soon forget the heroes of the past.

They cheer like mad until you fall and that's how long you last.

But God does not forget and in His Hall of Fame
