### General Education Guide

The CUI General Education (GE) requirement does not have to be completed prior to transfer. CUI does, however, accept the following in place of all of the CUI GE requirements except the Enduring Questions & Ideas (Q&I) Core and Theology course requirements (*one general education course in theology is required for each year of attendance at Concordia*):

- IGETC (Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum)
- CSU (California State University General Education Breadth Requirements)
- ADT (Associate Degree for Transfer)
- AA/AS (Associate of Arts/Science degrees which meet the CSU General Education Breadth Requirement)
