General Education Transfer Articulation Agreement

The CUI General Education (GE) requirements do not have to be completed prior to transfer. CUI does, however, accept the following in place of all of the CUI GE requirements **except** the Q&I Core and Theology course requirements:

- IGETC (Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum)
- CSU (California State University General Education Breadth Requirements)
- ADT (Associate Degree for Transfer)
- AA/AS (Associate of Arts/Science degrees which meet the CSU General Education Breadth Requirement)

Students who plan to enter CUI without completing an ADT, CSU, IGETC or AA/AS with CSU Breadth may take the courses below as noted to satisfy course-for-course alignment towards GE requirements. To be considered for transfer, courses must be completed with a grade of C- or better. View a complete list of Q&I Core requirements here:

***Students with 29 or fewer transfer units prior to the first term of attendance, must take the following GE (Q&I) requirements at CUI: Biology, English Literature, History and Math.**

****NOTE: Students must take at least 1 Social Science course (ANT, ECO, PSY, SOC, COM 216 or COM 324) in answering the question, "How Shall I Live?" or the question, "Who Am I and Who Are They?"**

Students are strongly encouraged to review major requirements prior to selecting GE courses to identify courses that may apply to both GE and major prerequisites/requirements.
